<b>Lernziele:</b> The objective of the course is to equip students with a critical understanding of contemporary macroeconomic theory, and to provide them with a methodological toolkit suitable for understanding the dynamics of complex systems. Lectures are in English.	
<b>Inhalte:</b> This course deals with alternative approaches to the usual equilibrium concepts in economics. As it turns out, many economic and financial variables of interest exhibit robust distributional regularities across space and time, but have received at best minor attention in the literature. We will consider recent developments in statistical equilibrium theory, which is particularly suitable for studying problems that arise from the aggregation of many agents. Ideally, students will conduct their own data exploration exercises, drawing on examples from financial markets, industrial dynamics, and the distribution of wealth. To look for distributional regularities in macroeconomic variables within or across countries.
